School Responsibilities

The (Joseph C. Shaner School, The George L. Hess Educational Complex and The William Davies Middle School) will:

1. Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the challenging State academic standards as follows;

The Basic Skills Improvement (BSI) Program is an in-class support, team-teaching program designed to provide instruction to students experiencing difficulty in language arts literacy and/or mathematics. Working cooperatively with the New Jersey State Department of Education's minimum level of proficiency mandates and Title I, supplemental instruction materials and teacher resources are available for students. The goal of the Basic Skills Program is to prepare students to meet with success in achieving mastery of the New Jersey Student Learning Standards as measured by the mandatory statewide standardized assessments (NJSLA). The Basic Skills Improvement Program has the following goals: To develop the basic skills necessary to function successfully in everyday life according to each student's individual ability level To provide a variety of experiences to meet the needs of students with a deficiency in basic functional reading, language, and mathematical skills To assist the students in developing a positive attitude toward themselves, their school, and the community To insure a continual means of communication between parents, teachers, students, and the community

2. Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually in elementary schools) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically, those conferences will be held;

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Parent -Teacher Conferences will be held formally at the end of the first marking period following the distribution of student report cards (November) and as needed prior to this and then thereafter

Parents will receive formal report cards three times per school year (each trimester), mid-trimester interims (each trimester), and basic skills progress reports each trimester. Additionally, informal reports for the students on an as needed basis as often as deemed necessary

HTSD ensures staff availability for consultation with parents on an ongoing basis relative to student needs and to provide a minimum of three Basic Skills Improvement Program Parental Involvement Workshops annually.

5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities, as follows;

HTSD will provide parents with opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class and to observe classroom activities, per the schools' formal and informal parent volunteer programs and/or as arranged by the administration, the teacher and the parent.

Parent Responsibilities

- Monitoring attendance

- Monitoring amount of television our children watch
- Volunteering, if possible, our children's classrooms as agreed upon by the building administration, teacher and parent

- Promoting positive use of our children's extracurricular time
- Staying informed about our children's education and communicating with the school by promptly reading all notices from the school or the school district either received by our children or by mail and responding, as appropriate

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- Serving, to the extent possible, on Parent Advisory Committees, Principal Advisory Committees, the Parent-Teacher Association Executive Boards and/or any other committee that supports our children's learning.

Student Responsibilities
